922 KAR 2:410E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the temperature of the surveyor was not taken before the surveyor was permitted entry into the child care center. During interview, the staff stated that they have been screening individuals; however, they did not think of screening the surveyor upon entrance to the center.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:410E Section 6. Screening and Illness Requirements. (1) Children and adults shall be screened for fever and contagious symptoms upon entry into the child care center.
