922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

- (1) A licensee shall:
- (a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and
- (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. An electrical outlet in the Infant Classroom located under a set of cubbies by the exit door that was missing two (2) outlet covers.
- 2. An electrical outlet in the Infant Classroom located behind a crib by a window that was missing one (1) outlet cover.
- 3. One (1) electrical outlet in the Toddler Classroom located beside the sink that was missing two (2) outlet covers.
- 4. One (1) pair of purple adult sized scissors placed inside a black container on a small shelf in the Toddler Classroom.
- 5. A tall white easel board leaned on the wall across from the small toilet in the restroom located between the Two and Three Year Old Classrooms.

405 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A staff's (DOH: 10/01/13) file did not contain documentation of a current TB skin test or a statement from a health professional stating that the staff person was free from active tuberculosis. The staff's file contained a TB skin test with an expiration date of 01/07/20.
- 2. A staff's (DOH: 10/10/17) file did not contain documentation of a current TB skin test or a statement from a health professional stating that the staff person was free from active tuberculosis. The staff's file contained a TB skin test with an expiration date of 01/02/20.

435 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found that a staff (DOH: 04/02/18) completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 09/28/16; therefore, the training was not completed within the last five years.

585 - Premises Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. An oval rug, alphabet rug, blue square rug with shapes, and a blue square rug that were soiled with dark spots in the Infant Classroom; therefore, the rugs were not kept clean.
- 2. An alphabet rug that was soiled with dark spots in the Three Year Old Classroom; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.
- 3. The sink did not appear to drain properly in the Three Year Old Classroom; therefore, the sink was not kept in good repair.
- 4. A purple square rug, blue square rug and orange square rug that were soiled with dark spots in the Toddler Classroom; therefore, the rugs were not kept clean.
- 5. A blue square rug in the Preschool Classroom that was soiled with dark spots; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.

695 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The toilet seat moved easily and was not tightly secured to the toilet in the restroom located between the Two and Three Year Old Classrooms; therefore, the toilet was not kept in good repair.
- 2. The small toilet contained what appeared to be a rust/brown substance around the toilet seat hinges underneath the seat in the restroom located between the Two and Three Year Old Classrooms; therefore, the toilet was not kept in clean condition.
- 3. The toilet bowl contained what appeared to be feces in the restroom located in the Preschool Classroom; therefore, the toilet was not kept in clean condition.

- (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;
- (e) Well drained;
- (f) Well maintained;

795 - Playground Conditions

- (g) In good repair; and
- (h) Visible to staff at all times.

Findings:

General: Based on observation of the playground, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A white metal cart placed under a wooden canopy that contained what appeared to be stacked pieces of playground border.
- 2. A broom that was missing the rubber handle and contained a rusty/sharp end located in a white metal cart that was placed under a wooden canopy.
- 3. What appeared to be animal droppings along the side of the child-care center building near the fenced in air unit.
- 4. A wooden border around a play structure that contained a long hole in the middle of the wood; therefore, this created a tripping hazard for the children.
- 5. A wooden border around a play structure that contained a broken/split center in an area located on the side. The border was observed to be unlevel in that area.
- 6. Three (3) green tricycles that were missing the rubber handles located near the ball goals.
- 7. One (1) orange tricycle that was missing one (1) petal located near the ball goals.
- 8. Two (2) ball goal metal poles that were peeling and contained rust.
- 9. The fence was slightly mangled at the bottom on a section of the fence roll located beside the entrance into the playground with the ball goals. A piece of the chain link was observed to be sticking out.
- 10. A green border around a play structure that contained a broken corner with a jagged edge.
- 11. A broken white plastic cover placed on the ground beside what appeared to be an old water fountain that contained one (1) exposed nail/screw.
- 12. What appeared to be a small silver metal stake that came to a point on the end and contained rust located inside an old water fountain.
- 13. A brown sand table located underneath a car port that was uncovered and full of ice/water.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a white boppy pillow placed on the edge of a crib that contained what appeared to be yellow spots and a small rip/tear; therefore, the boppy pillow was not kept clean or in good repair.
