General: Based on Review of Documentation, four (4) staff hired on 4/22/14 had TB skin documentation on file that was no longer current as of 2/11/18, 6/15/18, 6/16/18, and 6/24/18.

410 - Training

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and ECE-TRIS, it was found two (2) staff (hire dates: 3/20/17 and 10/4/17) completed orientation training past the ninety-day time frame. The training was completed on 6/7/18 and 6/8/18. Additionally, two (2) staff hired on 4/22/14 have not renewed the abusive pediatric head trauma training.

General: Based on Observation, the surveyor found the overhead light fixtures in the boys' restrooms located in Pre-K Academy and Varsity Classrooms did not contain protective covers. Additionally, the overhead light fixture in the girls' restroom located in the Varsity Classroom did not contain a protective cover. It is unknown if the light bulbs were shatter proof. It is important to note the other light fixtures found in other restrooms had protective covers.

General: Based on Observation, the surveyor noted there were several areas of chipped and peeling paint along the wall in the Pre-school #1 classroom. The surveyor noted there was purple paint showing through a couple of areas along the wall where the white paint was peeling. Additionally, the surveyor observed several areas of chipped paint along the wall located near the back door exit in the Toddler 3 classroom. The director stated she was aware the classrooms were in need of painting.

The surveyor found a discolored toilet lid that was not clean in the boys' restroom located in the Pre-K Academy. Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the surveyor observed an opening at the bottom of the fence that presented an entrapment hazard on the Toddler 3 playground. The bottom of the fence did not meet the ground. The opening was large enough that would permit a toddler's head, feet, and hands to go through. The director stated she was aware of this issue and was planning on getting it corrected.

General: Based on Observation, the surveyor observed a broken hand-soap dispenser lying on top of the hand-washing sink located in the downstairs Pre-K Academy classroom. The director stated she was aware the soap dispenser was broken.

(a) Be licensed and approved by the cabinet or its designee prior to transporting a child;

(b) Have a written plan that details the type of transportation, staff schedule, transportation schedule, and transportation route; and

(c) Have written policies and procedures, including emergency procedures practiced monthly by staff who transports children.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, within the transportation binder presented for review, the surveyor found a blank document labeled "Bus Evacuation Practice Drills". The surveyor found there was a procedure for staff to follow in case of needing to evacuate the bus, but it was unclear if the staff practice the procedure every month. The director indicated that drills were practiced during the school-year.

890 - Vehicle Inspection Documentation

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Transportation.

(6) A vehicle used to transport children shall meet the following requirements:

(a) For a twelve (12) or more passenger vehicle, the child-care center shall maintain a current certification of inspection from the Transportation Cabinet.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the surveyor found the vehicle used to transport children from school and on field trips had not been inspected by the transportation cabinet since 2016. A review of documentation found the last inspection conducted of the 2005 Chevrolet Express Bus was completed by the Kenton County Sheriff's office on 8/19/16.
