- (3.) One (1) electrical outlet had no protective covering in the Nursery. The outlet was located next to a crib where it was easily accessible to the children.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found A+D Diaper Rash Creme in a cubby underneath the diaper changing table. The item was located in the Nursery and was accessible to the children. During interview, staff was unaware that the diaper rash creme needed to be inaccessible to the children.
