(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child shall be:

- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:
- a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. At approximately 3:04 PM, a five-year-old child exited the cafeteria to go to the restroom. The child went to the restroom alone. The restroom is located out the cafeteria door and around the corner from the cafeteria. The staff members in the cafeteria were helping children prepare to move to other areas of the building and separate into smaller groups. The child in the bathroom was not within sight or sound of the staff members in the cafeteria. At approximately 3:07 PM, a staff went to the restroom to check on the child. The five-year-old child was unsupervised for approximately three minutes. The child and staff returned back to the cafeteria at approximately 3:08 PM together.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

(1) A licensee shall:

- (a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and
- (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. Upon the surveyor's arrival into the cafeteria at approximately 2:57 PM, all of the children's backpacks, coats, and personal belongings were sitting on the floor against the wall in the cafeteria. The items were stored touching one another. This promotes the spread of germs. At approximately 3:09 PM, the children took their personal belongings to another part of the building and stored them in laundry baskets. The staff in charge indicated that usually from 2:35 PM, (dismissal) the children's personal belongings are stored in the floor of the cafeteria until they separate into groups at around 3:10 PM and at that time the personal belongings are moved to the laundry baskets outside the media center.

- 4. Documentation of compliance with tuberculosis screening in accordance with Section 11(1)(b) of this administrative regulation; and
- 5. The results of background checks conducted in accordance with 922 KAR 2:280;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. None of the staff files presented for review contained dates of hire.

435 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A staff member hired on 8/14/2015, (hire date taken from the ECE-TRIS system) completed PAHT training on 8/04/2016; however, did not renew the training due on 8/04/2021. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed and confirmed this finding.

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A child enrolled on 12/06/2021, had an immunization certificate on file that was no longer current. The immunization certificate was dated 11/23/2021.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The staff in charge was unable to locate the emergency preparedness plan or written evidence of the submission of the emergency preparedness plan as specified in KRS 199.895.

1305 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (12) A fire drill shall be:
- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least monthly; and
- (b) Documented
- (13) An earthquake drill, shelter-in-place or lockdown drill, and tornado drill shall be:
- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least quarterly; and
- (b) Documented.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The facility did not have any documented shelter-in-place/lockdown drills. These drills are to be conducted quarterly.

- 1. Current rates for child care; and
- 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and
- (g) Daily planned program.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The facility did not have the parent's and children's rights as specified in KRS 199.898(3) posted.
