- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 07/31/19, did not complete orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled 06/24/2020, a child enrolled 07/01/19, and two (2) children each enrolled 05/23/19, did not have information on file to enable the person in charge to contact the child's preferred hospital and physician and did not have emergency authorization. A child enrolled 09/22/16, did not have information on file to enable the person in charge to contact the child's physician.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, monthly fire drills and the quarterly earthquake and tornado drills were conducted, but the names of the children who participated were not documented.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the center failed to assure each adult, including parents and guardians, at drop-off and pick-up, wore a face mask while inside a child care center, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:400E Section 7(1). Surveyor observed a caregiver's mask hang away from her face down below her nose, which left her nose exposed, in the school-age room and two-year-olds' room. In addition, the center failed to assure staff wear gloves when preparing meals and serving bottles and changed gloves between bottle feedings, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:400E Section 7(5). Surveyor observed two (2) infant caregivers, each wear gloves to feed an infant and did not change the gloves before feeding a second infant.
