Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. From 9:56 am through 11:58 am, a teacher in Nursery room was observed supervising six (6) children whose age ranged from two-months-old to one-years-old without any assistance. In addition, the director acknowledged that the child care center failed to maintain the minimum staff-to-child ratios due to an unexpected shortage of staff during the mornings hours on the date of survey.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 $^{\prime}\!\!\!/_2$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. The child care center did not produce verification from the Early Care and Education Training Records Information System (ECE-TRIS) that two (2) staff members with hire dates of 10/15/1993 and 5/15/2017 received fifteen (15) hours of annual cabinet approved early care and education training.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. Review of ten (10) children's files revealed that one (1) file for a child with an enrollment date of 7/11/2018 and three (3) files for children with enrollment dates of 10/1/2018 did not list the child's physician. In addition, one (1) file for a child with an enrollment date 2/26/18 did not have the preferred hospital listed in the file.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulations. A review of the quarterly earthquake and tornado drills as well as the monthly fire drills from January 2018 through April 2019 revealed that names of the children who participated in the drills were not listed.
