General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A bottle of Hobby Antibacterial Hand Soap that stated, "Keep Out of the Reach of Children," on the label was placed on the sink in the restroom located in front of the Infant
- 2. A plunger was placed beside the toilet in the second stall of the restroom located in front of the Lunch Room.
- 3. A small white shelf in the Two Year Old Classroom contained an exposed screw in the front part of the middle top shelf. A gray/pink blanket was observed to be placed on the middle top shelf. The Two Year Old Classroom was located on the right side of the hallway beside the restrooms.
- 4. A white charger with cord was placed on a gray shelf behind a small clear container with no lid in the Two Year Old Classroom located beside the restrooms.
- 5. A bottle of Fresh Citrus Antibacterial Hand Soap that stated, "Keep Out of the Reach of Children," on the label was placed on the sink in the first and second restrooms located in front of the Two Year Old Classroom.

(8) Each center shall ensure that every staff member has received training on first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that a staff's (DOH: 06/09/22) file did not contain documentation that the staff person received training on First Aid and CPR. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the staff person had not completed the training.

435 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A staff (DOH: 06/09/22) obtained zero (0) hours of the required six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training; therefore, the training was not completed within the first three (3) months of employment. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the staff person had not completed the training
- 2. A staff (DOH: 03/12/19) obtained three (3) hours of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training for the review period 07/01/21 06/30/22. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the staff person completed trainings; however, the trainings did not count because the staff person had completed the trainings prior.

- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A clear spray bottle that had "Bleach Water" written on the front of the bottle was placed inside an unlocked brown cabinet in the Two Year Old Classroom located beside the School Age Classroom. The classroom was located on the right side of the hallway. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the classroom had not been utilized by children for approximately one (1) year.
- 2. A clear spray bottle that had "Bleach" written on the front of the bottle was placed on top of a silver shelf in the restroom located in front of the Two Year Old Classroom. Through interview, the surveyor learned that school age children utilized the restroom.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A black garbage can that contained a green substance on the lid was in the restroom located in front of the Infant Classroom; therefore, the garbage can was not kept clean.
- 2. A brown residue was on the countertop behind the faucet in the restroom located in front of the Infant Classroom; therefore, the countertop was not kept clean.
- 3. A brown residue was on the countertop behind the faucet in the restroom located in front of the Lunch Room; therefore, the countertop was not kept clean.
- 4. Black debris was found in the corner of the window sill in the Preschool Classroom; therefore, the window sill was not kept clean.
- 5. Black debris was found in the window sill in the Two Year Old Classroom located between the Three Year Old and School Age Classrooms; therefore, the window sill was not kept
- 6. A brown residue was found on the countertop behind the faucet in the second restroom located in front of the Two Year Old Classroom; therefore, the countertop was not kept

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. One (1) Little Tike Cozy Coupe Car missing one (1) door was located on the playground located behind the child-care center building.
- 2. One (1) Little Tikes Cozy Coupe Car was missing one (1) door and contained broken plastic on the playground located behind the child-care center building.
- 3. One (1) Little Tikes Cozy Coupe Car missing two (2) doors was located on the playground behind the child-care center building.
- 4. A blue canopy was folded and leaned against the fence beside the exit door on the playground located behind the child-care center building.
- 5. A small orange toy that contained broken plastic was placed on the top step of a small red/blue plastic play structure with slide on the playground located behind the child-care center building.
- 6. What appeared to be a spinning tea cup merry go round that was missing part of what appeared to be a rubber material on the wheel used to spin, exposing the metal underneath, was located on the playground behind the child-care center building. A child sized chair was observed to be placed on top of the wheel. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the chair was placed on top of the wheel so the children could not utilize the merry go round. Staff-in-charge stated that staff were also aware that children are not to utilize the merry go round.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that the following children's (DOE: 01/03/22, 07/18/22, 07/15/20, 03/08/21, 08/01/22, 04/05/21, 04/18/22, 04/30/16, 08/17/20, and 08/01/22) files did not contain the contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital.

General: Based on review of documentation, The surveyor found that the fire, earthquake, tornado, and lockdown drills were conducted at the same time and not documented separately. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that she would conduct the drills at different times.
