225 - Licensee Responsibility

922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

(1) A licensee shall:

(a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the surveyor found multiple staff had concerns that a staff person was under the influence of marijuana during work hours; the staff was described as being "higher than a kite" while at the facility. The staff's eyes were red and swollen, and she indicated that she had been crying due to personal issues. The staff person was sent for a drug screening on 9/24/2021 and she resigned upon return to the facility. A review of the drug screen results found that the staff person tested positive for Cannabinoids (marijuana). Therefore, the staff person was under the influence of marijuana while caring for children in the One-Year-Old Room. A review of the facility's written drug policy found that random drug tests would be conducted every six months. Interviews with staff found that random drug tests have not been conducted due to being short staffed.
