835 - Maintain Records

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding transportation. A review of documentation for a trip conducted in May 2018, failed to reveal a written plan including: staff schedule, transportation schedule, plan to ensure staff perform duties, and transportation route. Interview with the provider revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the inspection.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding transportation. A review of documentation failed to reveal a written record for a trip taken in 05/2019, with the first and last name of each child transported, and the time each child gets on and the time each child gets of the vehicle. The record must be completed by a staff member other than the driver. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.

- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of three (3) children's files failed to reveal a designated hospital for two (2) of the enrolled children. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the inspection.
