Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor discovered that a staff's personnel file (DOH: 8/3/2016) contained a negative tuberculin result that was no longer current after 1/15/2021; therefore, the child-care center failed to show proof that the employee was free of active tuberculosis or provide a copy of a negative tuberculin result.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

(17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

1. A staff (DOH: 8/3/2016) completed pediatric abusive head trauma training on 3/10/2017; therefore, the staff did not complete the training once every five (5) years. Staff reported she would have the staff complete the training.

2. Two (2) staff (DOH: 8/3/2016, 2/1/2008) obtained zero (0) of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training between 7/1/2020 through 6/30/2021.

3. A staff (DOH: 8/18/2008) obtained ten (10) of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training between 7/1/2020 through 6/30/2021.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found a child's (DOE: 8/8/2019) immunization certificate was no longer current after 3/2/2021; therefore, the child-care center failed to maintain a current immunization certificate for the child.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor discovered the following:

1. The personnel file for staff (DOH: 8/15/2007) contained a professional development plan dated 10/11/2020.

2. The personnel file for staff (DOH: 8/18/2008) contained a professional development plan dated 8/7/2019.

Therefore, the child-care center failed to ensure that the staff completed professional development plans annually.

Staff-in-charge stated that the staff must have failed to complete new professional development plans.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor was unable to locate a posting of the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program flyer at the child-care center. Staff-in-charge stated she forgot to post the flyer; therefore, the child-care center failed to post information regarding the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program.
