Both caregivers took a total of six (6) toddlers to the covered area of the playground to look at the ground. One (1) toddler was left on the far side of the large play structure, beyond the scope of vision of both caregivers. The toddler was unsupervised for approximately two (2) minutes. The toddler was injured while unsupervised.</p>

Director Requirements and Responsibilities.</p> <p>(1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:</p> <p>(l) Provide for the health, safety, and comfort of each child;</p> <p>Findings:</p> <p>General: Based on observation of video footage dated 3-8-17, the safety and comfort of a toddler was compromised when two (2) caregivers supervised seven (7) toddlers on the playground. Both caregivers took six (6) toddlers to the covered area of the playground. Interviews determined they were looking at worms on the ground. One (1) toddler was left on the far side of the large play structure, beyond the scope of vision of both caregivers, for approximately two (2) minutes. The toddler was injured while unsupervised. Interview with staff determined they did not witness the toddler receive the injury. They heard the child cry, one staff went to the child and saw he had a cut above his left eye. The parent took the child to the local emergency room and the doctor closed the wound with surgical glue.</p>
