Findings:

General: Based on observation, classroom 103 had several boxes stacked near the front of the classroom. The boxes contained several items including several bottles of Gorilla Glue, which reads, "Keep out of reach of children."

560 - Building Requirements

General: Based on observation, classroom 110 contained a heating element with piping. The piping had an insulation covering; however, the insulation was ripped allowing access to the hot-to-touch piping.

General: Based on observation, children's cloth items were overlapping in the Four- to Five-year-old classroom; this method of storage promotes cross contamination of germs and bacteria.

- (b) Pasteurized whole milk for children ages twelve (12) months to twenty-four (24) months; or
- (c) Pasteurized low fat one (1) percent or fat-free skim milk for children ages twenty-four (24) months to school-age.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, children in classroom 104 bring their lunches from home; however, none of the children had brought milk and the childcare facility did not supplement this component.

995 - Lunch/Dinner Requirements

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the students in classroom 104 bring their own lunch, and one child had brought only a Pizza Lunchable with a Capri Sun; this meal did not contain a fruit or vegetable. The facility did not provide a supplement to meet the components for mealtime.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a staff member hired 9/1/2020, did not have evidence of a Child Abuse and Neglect Check, nor a State Police background check in their personnel file. This staff member was working alone with eight children aged four to five. The staff person in charge stated that she believed that the checks had been submitted, but was unable to locate the documentation. This violation was cited during the 2020 renewal process.
