Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed two (2) 6.17 ounce containers of Airwick Air Fresheners, (Bright Citrus Splash), with the warning: Keep Out of the Reach of Children, on a shelf above the toilet, and accessible to children.

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed all windows in the Toddler and Toddler Plus rooms revealed cobwebs and dead insects on blinds and windowsills.

Findings:

580 - Toilet Room

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed ten (10) children ranging in age from three (3) years to nine (9) years using the restroom while leaving the door open allowing children of the opposite sex to watch as children used the toilet and exposed themselves to the children watching outside the door. Children were purposely showing their private parts to children of the opposite sex, making them laugh while the staff member was attempting to have the children stand in line, unaware of the children's actions.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Two (2) children were observed in the Toddler room failing to have their hands washed after diapering.

600 - Staff Hygiene/Handwashing

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements. (5) Staff shall:

- (a) Maintain personal cleanliness;
- (b) Conform to hygienic practices while on duty; and
- (c) Wash their hands with liquid soap and running water:
- 1. Upon arrival at the center;
- 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;
- 3. Before and after diapering each child;
- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. A staff member in the Toddler room failed to wash her hands before diapering two (2) children and after diapering one (1) of the children. Additionally, a staff member failed to wash her hands after wiping a toilet seat with toilet tissue to remove urine.

Additionally, a table containing approximately 1 1/2 inches of water was observed in the play area, creating a foreseeable hazard to the children in the outdoor play area used by the children.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Daily attendance records revealed a parent signature confirming the accuracy of the week's attendance prior to the completion of the week. The child had been signed in for the day of the survey (Wednesday), and had not yet been signed out for the day.
