922 KAR 2:280. Section 3. Implementation and Enforcement.

(1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.

(2) A child care staff member hired on or after January 1, 2018, shall:

(a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or

(b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;

2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative

regulation; and

3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff-in-charge did not present documentation of background checks for a staff member with the hire date of 4/18/18. Interview with staff-in-charge could not verify if not documentation was currently pending. Staff was observed working alone with children for the duration of survey.

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with the regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff-in-charge did not present current liability insurance for the center. Documentation on file expired 4/24/18.

Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities. (1) A director shall: (j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation; Findings: General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff-in-charge did not present a staff file with current annual evaluation for staff with hire date 7/28/14.

360 - Caregiver Alone

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

(1) A director shall:

(n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:280;

Findings:

Based on review of documentation and observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Through the duration of the survey a staff member with hire date 4/18/18 was observed with a class of nine (9) children alone. Review of staff file revealed that the staff member did not have, nor completed, background checks or fingerprints through the KARES system.

400 - CPR/First Aid Coverage

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:

(a) Infant and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and

(b) Infant and child first aid.

(4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:

(a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and

(b) First aid.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff-in-charge did not present proof of current CPR and First Aid certification. Throughout the duration of survey no one at the center had current certification. Staff-in- charge presented certification for staff members with hire date 7/28/14 and 4/16/14 that expired 4/2018. The center has three(3) current staff members, none of which have current CPR/First Aid certification.

405 - Adequate Substitute(s)

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(6) Child-care centers shall have available in case of need:

- (a) One (1) qualified substitute staff person for a Type II child-care center; or
- (b) Two (2) qualified substitute staff persons for a Type I child-care center.

(7) Each qualified substitute staff person shall:

- (a) Meet the staff requirements of this administrative regulation: and
- (b) Provide the required documentation to verify compliance with this administrative regulation.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff-in-charge did not present documentation or files for adequate subsitutes as there are only three(3) staff members including the director.

410 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff-in-charge did not present fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training through ECE-TRIS records for staff member with the hire date of 4/16/14.

(7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care: (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides; (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff. Findings: General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The bathroom near the two-year-old class had a white toilet bowl brush sitting in some form of liquid near the toilet, accessible to children in care. 640 - Toilet Room 922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements. (2) A toilet room shall: (a) 1. Be provided for each gender; or 2. A plan shall be implemented to use the same toilet room at separate times; (b) Have a supply of toilet paper; and (c) Be cleaned and disinfected daily. Findings: General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Surveyor observed school age children using one single bathroom with the door open as the other children sat in front of the door. The children were able to view the opposite gender going to the bathroom. **Hygienic Practices** 685 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface 922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements. (10) When a child is diapered, the child shall: (b) Be placed on a surface that is: 1. Clean: 2. Padded; 3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage; 4. Nonabsorbent; 5. Easily cleaned: and 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing. Findings: General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. The white changing pad located in the room with the two-year-old class had a dime sized tear in it. **First Aid/Medication Outdoor Play Area** Equipment Transportation Food Service/Food Program **Food Service** Children's Records 1135 - Immunization 922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records. (1) A child-care center shall maintain: (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff-in-charge did not present a current immunization record for child's file with the enrollment date of 1/4/18. Review of documentation revealed the immunization on file expired 11/14/17.
