General: Based on observation, an electrical outlet was not covered in the dining room.

General: Based on review of documentation, the director had only one (1) documented staff meeting.

- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 11/1/21, did not have TB documentation on file. A caregiver hired on 4/16/14, had TB documentation on file dated

- (3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:

- (b) Infant and child first aid.
- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the caregivers present from 9:30 a.m., to 10:30 a.m., were not currently certified in first aid and CPR.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, the center had only one (1) substitute available in case of need.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 4/16/14, had eleven and three-fourth (11 3/4) hours of training during the subsequent year of employment.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 11/22/21, was employed by an outside agency, Caring Hearts. There was no contractual agreement between the center and the outside agency available for review. A caregiver hired from an outside agency on 11/22/21, did not have a criminal records check, child abuse and neglect check, and sex offender registry from the state of Michigan. The caregiver was alone with children upon arrival and periodically throughout the survey.

General: Based on observation, a broken thermometer was in the kitchen refrigerator. Therefore, the temperature could not be determined.

General: Based on review of documentation, four (4) children enrolled on 5/28/18, 8/9/21, 8/17/21, 8/2/21, and two (2) children each enrolled on 8/23/21, did not have an immunization certificate on file.

- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and

- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a fire drill conducted on 4/19/21, did not indicate the time the drill occurred.

- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least monthly; and
- (b) Documented.
- (13) An earthquake drill, shelter-in-place or lockdown drill, and tornado drill shall be:

General: Based on review of documentation, there was no lockdown drill conducted during the third quarter of 2021. A fire drill was conducted on 4/19/21, but the documentation did not include the time the drill was conducted.

General: Based on record review and observation, a statement of deficiencies and plan of corrections were in a binder located in the foyer. The statement of deficiencies and plan of corrections were dated 7/11/19. Therefore, the center did not have the current statement of deficiencies and plan of corrections available for parents to review.

General: Based on observation, there was no posted schedule of daily activities in the pre-k room, one-year-olds' room, and two-year-olds' room.
