General: Based on observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. There was one (1) exposed electrical outlet above the mantle and two (2) exposed electrical outlets by the red top sink in the Two's Room. There was a potty seat located on the floor next to the toilet in the bathroom in the Two-Year-Old Room.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a: 1. High school diploma:

2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or

3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented employee files revealed a staff member with hire date 9/27/16 whose file did not contain a high school diploma, GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity.

320 - TB Verification

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:

1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented employee files revealed a staff member with hire date 7/21/17 whose file did not contain a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis. The Director did not provide a current statement for the employee at the time of the survey.

340 - Training

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

(14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented employee records revealed staff members with hire dates 10/21/14, 9/8/15, 4/18/16, 6/18/15, 5/18/16 and 6/20/14 had not completed the fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training. Review of the ECE-TRIS report verified that the staff members did not complete the fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training. The Director did not provide documentation to verify that staff member had completed fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training. Review of presented staff records revealed staff members with hire dates 9/27/16, 11/10/16, 1/3/17, 4/12/17 and 5/18/16 had not completed orientation training within the first ninety (90) days of employment. Continued review of the presented employee records revealed staff members with hire dates 4/18/16, 6/18/15 and 5/18/16 had not completed the one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training within the first year of employment.

Programming

Premises

520 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. There was a crack in the ceiling located in the Pre-K Room by the entrance to the room.

585 - Sink

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(3) A sink shall be:

(a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;

(b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;

(c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;

(d) Equipped with liquid soap;

(e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;

(f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and

(g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The sink located in the Two's Room was not equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material.

700 - Fences

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(23) Fences shall be:

(a) Constructed of safe material;

(b) Stable; and

(c) In good condition.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. The fence surrounding the back of the child care center had a broken pole due to a tree laying on the fence, another portion had a cracked pole and a portion of the fence over to the side had another tree laying on a portion of the fence

Equipment

755 - Toys/Equipment/Furniture

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (1) All toys, equipment, and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and

(b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. The kitchen set located in the dramatic play area in the Two-Year-Old Room was missing the sink, it was just a hole where the sink should have been located.

760 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

(2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:

(a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;

(b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;

(c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and

(d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. The first dramatic play house located on the outside play area was dirty and the second dramatic play house located on the outside play area was dirty, missing a shutter and had a cracked window ledge. The yellow turtle tunnel located on the outside play area was cracked and missing a portion of yellow overlay. The red riding apparatus located on the outside play area was missing two (2) of the pedal cushions.

950 - Kitchen Equipment Clean and Sanitary

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.

- (7) The following shall be clean and sanitary:
- (a) Eating and drinking utensils;
- (b) Kitchenware:
- (c) Food contact surfaces of equipment;
- (d) Food storage utensils;
- (e) Food storage containers;
- (f) Cooking surfaces of equipment; and

(g) Nonfood contact surfaces of equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. The microwave located in the kitchen was soiled with food debris. The bottom shelf and door shelves of the 1st white refrigerator located in the kitchen was dirty and soiled with food debris. The bottom shelf of the refrigerator used to store milk was dirty and soiled with food debris.

Children's Records

1070 - Immunization

922 KAR 2:110. Section 3. Records.

(1) A child-care center shall maintain:

(a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

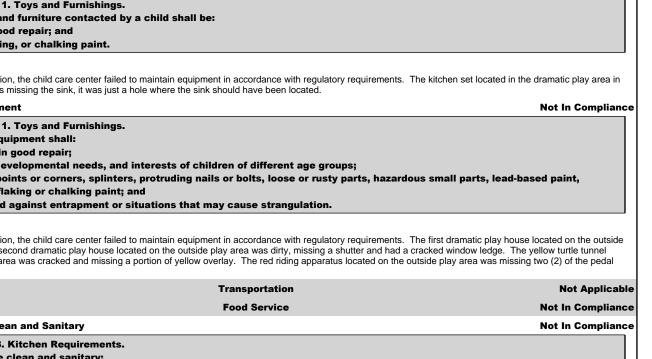
Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented children's records revealed a child with enrollment date 7/7/16 whose file did not contain a current immunization certificate. The Director did not provide a current immunization for the child at the time of the survey.
