- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, staff hired on 07/30/15 and 08/19/04 did not have documentation on file from a health care professional stating they were free of active tuberculosis.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, staff hired on 08/19/04, 08/15/16 and 10/14/14 did not have the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training on file. Staff hired on 10/23/17 did not have the required Orientation I and II training on file. This information was verified through ECE-TRIS.

General: Based on Observation, there was a large paper-cutter located in the teacher's work room. One of the doors that leads to the work room is located in Classroom II. The door to the work room was not locked, leaving the room accessible to the children in care.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector:
  - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12 if an epinephrine autoinjector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, there was an unlocked cabinet in the adult restroom that is located in Classroom I. The cabinet contained a bottle of Tylenol, a bottle of Advil, a bottle of children's cough syrup, a tube of sunscreen and an epi-pen
