(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

### Findings:

410 - Training

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files and ECE-TRIS report revealed the fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training was not presented for review at the time of survey for the staff member with the hire date of 07/11/2007.

Further review of the staff files for the staff member with the hire date of 05/27/2004 revealed the cabinet approved Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma; (PAHT) was not completed once every five (5) years.

Interview with the director revealed the requested information was unavailable at the time of survey.

- (a) Be available to provide prompt and proper first aid treatment;
- (b) Be stored out of reach of a child;
- (c) Be periodically inventoried to ensure the supplies have not expired;
- (d) If reusable, be:
- 1. Sanitized; and
- 2. Maintained in a sanitary manner; and
- (e) Include:
- 1. Liquid soap;
- 2. Adhesive bandages;
- 3. Sterile gauze;
- 4. Medical tape;
- 5. Scissors;
- 6. A thermometer;
- 7. Flashlight;
- 8. Cold pack;
- 9. First aid book;
- 10. Disposable gloves; and
- 11. A cardiopulmonary resuscitation mouthpiece protector.

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain first aid medication in accordance with regulations. Review of the first aid supplies presented revealed the Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) mouthpiece protector was missing.

Interview with the director revealed the whereabouts of the Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) mouthpiece protector was unknown, and could not be located at the time of survey.
