### Findings:

410 - Training

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the center did not have a procedure to ensure complaince with and to inform the staff of the laws of the Commonwealth, which pertained to child abuse and neglect set forth in KRS 620.030. Documentation revealed "When there is suspicion of abuse or neglect, the staff person needs to report immediately to the director of their suspicions. The director will report the suspected cases to the Department of Human Services." Interviews confirmed the above statement was the center's child abuse/neglect policy.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 02/13/14, completed 3.5 hours of annual training.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) large bottles of hand sanitizer set on two (2) tables in the cafeteria and one (1) large bottle of hand sanitizer set on a wooden desk in the gym. The bottles were labeled "Keep out of reach of children". These bottles were accessible to the children in the gym and in the cafeteria.

# 580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

**Not In Compliance** 

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

General: Based on observation, an excessive amount of chipping and flaking paint was observed on the walls in the gym and the cafeteria. These two (2) areas were utilized by the after school children Monday through Friday.

- (5) Staff shall:
- (a) Maintain personal cleanliness;
- (b) Conform to hygienic practices while on duty;
- (c) Except as established in paragraph (d) of this subsection, wash their hands with liquid soap and running water:
- 1. Upon arrival at the center;

660 - Staff Hygiene/Handwashing

- 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;
- 3. Before and after diapering each child;
- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;
- 5. After handling animals;
- 6. After caring for a sick child;
- 7. Before and after feeding a child or eating;
- 8. Before dispensing medication;
- 9. After smoking or vaping; and
- 10. If possible, before administering first aid; and
- (d) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. The staff shall wash the staff's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, three (3) caregivers used hand sanitizer but did not wash their hands when they arrived to begin their shift. A caregiver used hand sanitizer but did not wash her hands after she wiped a school age child's nose.

General: Based on observation, several large areas of brown spots were on the ceiling tiles in the cafeteria. Interview determined there had been a ceiling leak but after repairs, the ceiling had not painted to cover the brown spots.

- (d) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's Website as specified in KRS 199.897;
- (e) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including:
- 1. Current rates for child care; and
- 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and
- (g) Daily planned program.

### Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Commission Program and the prgoram's website was not posted. Interview with the staff in charge determined she was not aware this information was to be posted.
