Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that a free-standing floor fan was operating in the indoor gross motor room. The children were observed to go past this fan multiple times.

- (5) An individual described in subsection (4) of this section shall:
- (a) Submit to background checks described in paragraph (b) of this subsection;
- (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file for an employee rehired on 8-25-16 did not contain evidence of submission for or the results of a criminal records check or a central registry check. This employee was not observed to be alone with children.



315 - Educational Requirements

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
- 1. High school diploma:
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the files for employees hired on 6-28-16, 6-30-16 and 8-15-16 did not contain evidence of a high school diploma, GED, Commonwealth Childcare Credential or a letter from their school stating that they were enrolled in secondary education.

320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the files for employees hired on 7-25-14, 8-21-14 and 9-16-14 contained TB skin tests dated 4-9-14, 8-15-14 and 9-5-14. These dates are not within the two (2) year timeframe as required. It was also found that the file for an employee hired on 8-15-16 did not contain a TB skin test or screening.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the ECE-TRIS records and files for employees hired on 5-18-15 and 8-20-15 contained no evidence of Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training being completed. It was also found that the ECE-TRIS record and file for an employee hired on 2-17-16 contained no evidence of the six-hour cabinet-approved orientation training being completed.

(6) Regularity of routines shall be implemented to afford the child familiarity with the daily schedule of activity.

Findings:

General: Based on Interview, it was found that children are moved from classroom to classroom based on the days ratios and attendance.

Premises Not In Compliance

460 - Inaccessible Items Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that there was a large pile of empty plastic bags on the floor between the changing table and the wall of the women's bathroom. This bathroom is used by the children. It was also found that the shower stall in the women's bathroom contained a plunger, an empty plastic bag and a can of AirWick air freshener.

465 - Items Accessible Only During Activity

- (8) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care unless under direct supervision and part of planned program of instruction:
- (a) Knives and sharp objects;
- (b) Litter and rubbish; and

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that there was a large pile of empty plastic bags on the floor between the changing table and the wall of the women's bathroom. These bags were not being used as part of a scheduled activity.



520 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the bottom portion of the brown walls in the indoor gross motor area were scarred in multiple areas. The paint was chipped and the walls deeply gouged in many places. There was also a round hole in one of the walls.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that there was a multi-colored Graco Pack N Play in the office. The Pack N Play was not labeled as being approved for commercial use. The director stated that the Pack N Play is used for napping by a two-year-old child who has problems falling asleep.

755 - Toys/Equipment/Furniture

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the seat of a Mickey Mouse chair located in the four and five-year-old (4 and 5) classroom was torn, exposing the foam and metal beneath the vinyl.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file for a child enrolled on 8-1-16 contained an immunization certificate that was no longer current as of 7-14-16.

- (b) A written record for each child:
 - 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and

- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that two (2) children's files out of ten (10) files reviewed did not contain information regarding the parent's preferred hospital.

(1) A licensed child-care center shall have a written evacuation plan in the event of a fire, natural disaster, or other threatening situation that may pose a health or safety hazard for a child in care in accordance with KRS 199.895.

Findings:

General: Based on Interview, it was found that the director was unable to locate the facility's emergency preparedness plan according to KRS199.8982.

1095 - Daily Attendance Records Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 3. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (c) Daily attendance records documenting the arrival and departure time of each child, including records that are required in accordance with 922 KAR 2:160, Section 13, if a child receives services from the child-care center through the Child Care Assistance Program;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that only eighteen (18) of the twenty (20) children present were signed in to the facility.

1105 - Professional Development **Not In Compliance**

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (f) A written annual plan for child-care staff professional development;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the files for three (3) eligible employees did not contain evidence of an annual professional development plan being completed.
