Findings: General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements. Located on the bulletin board near the exit door for public inspection, there was information posted concerning a child's allergies. Therefore, the document was not kept in confidence by the child-care center staff. **Director Requirements** In Compliance **Employee Records** Not In Compliance 320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:110. # Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the records for the employees with the hire dates of 11/13/2014 and 08/01/2017 contained a current copy of a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or a copy of negative tuberculin results.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the daily activity of programming was posted in writing that had been updated to reflect the current week that included the activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child for four (4) out of five (5) classrooms Premises

(b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;	
(c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fa	hrenheit;
(d) Equipped with liquid soap;	
(e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;	
(f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and	
(g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.	

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation the child care center failed to maintain premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The changing tables located in the Infant II and twoyear-old classroom revealed the tables were not immediately adjacent to a sink used for infants and toddlers. The tables were located near the entry doorways, with the restroom sinks behind closed doors across the rooms. Continued observation of the Infant II classroom revealed the hot water temperature exceeded 120 degrees Fahrenheit.


- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon their developmental skills; and
- (b) Wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After wiping or blowing nose;
- 6. After touching items soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 7. After outdoor or indoor play time.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. In the one-year-old classroom, the employee completed a diaper change of a one-year-old, preceded to place the one-year-old at the table to eat lunch. Therefore, the employee did not follow handwashing procedures for the child.
