1255 - Emergency Regulation Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:405E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation the child care center failed to assure compliance with the emergency regulations specific to the current pandemic as established in 922 KAR 2:405e, which was effective at the time of the inspection. In accordance with 922 KAR 2:405e, machine washable toys must not be accessible to children; additionally, all adults and school age children should wear face masks while in the center. Observation in the toddler room revealed washable doll clothes accessible to children; in the preschool room there were soft puppets accessible to the children. Additionally, one child that was reported being six (6) years of age was not wearing a face mask.
