Implementation and Enforcement.</p> <p>(1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.</p> <p>(2) A child care staff member hired on or after January 1, 2018, shall:</p> <p>(a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or</p> <p>(b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;</p> <p>2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation; and</p> <p>3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.</p> <p>Findings:</p> <p>General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired 07/24/17, did not have her background checks on file. This caregiver supervised the three (3) toddler children alone upon surveyor arrival at 8:50 a.m., and was alone until 10:35 a.m.</p> | |

General: Based on interview, the center did not complete their annual parent involvement.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:

- 1. High school diploma;**
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or**
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;**

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired 07/24/17, and a caregiver hired 03/13/17, did not have their education verification on file.

410 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired 07/24/17, did not complete her orientation training. A caregiver hired 03/13/17, completed orientation training on 06/17/17; therefore, it was not completed within the first three (3) months of employment. A caregiver hired 04/17/12, completed 4.5 hours of annual training. A caregiver hired 03/17/97, completed 6 hours of annual training.

520 - Inaccessible Items

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

(7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:

- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;**
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and**
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, several nails protruded out of the railroad ties throughout the playground. Twenty-five (25) bags of plastic mulch were on a pallet inside the playground, and plastic wrap hung down from the pallet of mulch. A caregiver's bottle of soda was on a shelf, accessible to children in the preschool room.

540 - Premises Requirements

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(1) The premises shall be:

- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;**
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, torn paper, cups, and popsicle paper were scattered along the fence line on the playground. Also, what appeared to be a dirty diaper was in the corner of the fence. Several railroad ties were detached and lying on the ground in different areas throughout the playground.

560 - Building Requirements

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:

(a) Building is:

- 1. Dry;**
- 2. Ventilated; and**
- 3. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:**
 - a. In good repair in all areas; and**
 - b. Shielded or have shatter-proof bulbs installed; and**

(b) Following are protected:

- 1. Windows;**
- 2. Doors;**
- 3. Stoves;**
- 4. Heaters;**
- 5. Furnaces;**
- 6. Pipes; and**
- 7. Stairs.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the back left classroom did not have operable lighting. This room was used as an exit and entrance. The preschool children used this room to access their classroom. The door in this classroom was labeled with a sign which indicated "EXIT".

645 - Sink

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(3) A sink shall be:

- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;**
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;**
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;**
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;**
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;**
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and**
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the water temperature registered forty-five (45) degrees Fahrenheit at the hand washing sink in the preschool restroom.

650 - Toilet

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(4) Each toilet shall:

- (a) Be kept in clean condition;**
- (b) Be kept in good repair;**
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and**
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the water in the toilet bowl, in the preschool restroom, rose to the rim of the toilet bowl and slowly drained. Interview determined there had been problems with the toilet draining but thought it was fixed.

655 - Child Personal Care/Handwashing

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

(4) A child shall:

- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon their developmental skills; and**
- (b) Wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:**
 - 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or**
 - b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;**
 - 2. Before and after eating or handling food;**
 - 3. After toileting or diaper change;**
 - 4. After handling animals;**
 - 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and**
 - 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and**
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, three (3) toddler children did not wash their hands after they were diapered. Five (5) preschool children did not wash their hands before they ate lunch. One (1) preschool child did not wash hands after he wiped his nose.

730 - Medication

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:**
 - (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:**
 - 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;**
 - 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;**
 - 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:**
 - a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;**
 - b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;**
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and**
 - d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12 if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or**
 - 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;**
 - (b) Kept in the original bottle; and**
 - (c) Properly labeled.**
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a bottle of rubbing alcohol was on top of the refrigerator in the kitchen and a tube of Neosporin was stored in the first aid kit. These items were not locked and labeled to indicate for whom each was intended.

790 - Crib/Mattress/Sheet

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:**
 - (a) For an infant:**
 - 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;**
 - 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:**
 - a. Weekly; or**
 - b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the crib mattress was torn and exposed foam in the infants' room.

815 - Toys/Furniture

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (1) All toys and furniture contacted by a child shall be:**
 - (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and**
 - (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a soccer ball was torn and dry rotted on the playground.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:**
 - (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;**
 - (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;**
 - (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and**
 - (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the ceiling light flickered continuously in the preschool restroom. Two (2), eight (8) feet long ceiling lights did not work in the preschool room.
