General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain adequate supervision in accordance with regulatory requirements. The staff member in the infant room was in the process of a diaper change, while changing the diaper, the staff member turned her back and walked a few steps away to retrieve a bottle of baby lotion; therefore, leaving the child unattended

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the staff members with the hire dates of 03/15/1997, 02/15/1998, 08/15/2008, 04/30/2009 and 06/08/2009 had met the requirement of completing an updated training in pediatric abusive head trauma. Review of documentation in the ECE-TRIS training system revealed the staff members listed above had not met
