General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain regulatory programming requirements. Observation in the Infant room revealed four (4) infants in cribs containing loose blankets.

Observation in the school age room revealed a 19 ounce can of Homeline Antibacterial Disinfectant Spray, and a 32 ounce bottle of Lysol All Purpose Cleaner, both containing warnings of: Keep Out of the Reach of Children, on a shelf which was accessible to the school aged children.

The refrigerator failed to have a measuring device to verify the temperature to be less than 40 degrees Fahrenheit. Interview with the staff in charge agreed that the thermometer was not working, stating it had been dropped.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain compliance with emergency regulations. Upon entry into the center, the surveyor observed three (3) staff members pulling facial masks up over their mouths and noses. Therefore, the masks were not properly worn prior to the surveyor's arrival.
