Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation during the investigation, it was found that a seven-year-old child locked himself inside of a locker and was stuck in it for a few minutes before any of the staff noticed.

Staff reported that the class came inside from the outside playground at approximately 9:40 a.m. The children were counted as they entered the building. The children placed their jackets inside their lockers and went to the classroom. Staff reported that they did not count the children again once inside the classroom and did not notice that one of the children was not with the group.

The staff person in charge entered the classroom to remove a second staff person from the classroom because she was needed somewhere else. As they were walking in the hallway, passing the lockers, they heard someone crying. The staff person in charge opened the locker and found the seven-year-old child inside. The staff person in charge escorted the child to his classroom at approximately 9:44 am.

It is important to note, a staff person spoke to this child earlier that morning for making several attempts to get inside of his locker.
