Food Service

955 - Single Service Item Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.

- (8) A single-service item shall be:
- (a) Stored;
- (b) Handled and dispensed in a sanitary manner; and
- (c) Used only once.

Findings:

General: Based on Interview, it was found that the facility uses disposable cups, plates, bowls, napkins and utensils. Four (4) used styrofoam cups were observed in the sink and an additional one (1) that had been used was observed sitting on a shelf. There were no additional disposable cups at the facility and staff interviews found that they will wash the cups out and reuse them

965 - Food Clean/Free From Spoilage

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a large bag containing individual bags of Cheetos was observed sitting on the changing table. An interview with staff found that the Cheetos would be served for snack that afternoon. In addition a box of individual wrapped Pop Tarts was observed stored under the sink next to a can of bug spary.

970 - Food From Approved Source

Not In Compliance

Findings

General: Based on Observation, at the time of the visit the facility ordered a pepperoni pizza from Snappy Tomato Pizza. An interview with staff found they do not have a copy of the business' food service permit.

975 - Developmentally Appropriate Quantity/Additional Portions

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (1) Food shall be:
- (g) Served in a quantity that is developmentally appropriate for the child with additional portions provided upon request of the child;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, two (2) toddlers were served a very large square of pizza that was not cut up into small pieces. Both children exhibited difficulty in picking up the square of pizza and getting it to their mouths.

980 - Food Protected From Contamination

General: Based on Observation, the children were not served milk with their lunch.

Findings:

General: Based on Interview, with staff it was found that breakfast is over between 8:00 and 8:30 a.m. A review of the posted toddler and preschool daily schedule shows lunch being served from 11:30 a.m.-12:15 p.m. At the time of the visit an order for a pizza was placed at approximately 12:00 p.m. The pizza did not arrive until approximately 12:33 p.m. Once the children's hands were washed and their plates were filled the children did not sit down to eat until approximately 12:45 p.m. This exceeds the time allowed between each

General: Based on Observation, there were only five (5) used styrofoam cups in the facility and there were seven (7) children present.

- (b) Dated;
- (c) Posted in advance in a conspicuous place;

Findings:

General: Based on Interview, it was found that the parents are required to provide lunch for their child and the facility provides breakfast and snack. Based on observation it was found that there was not a dated, weekly menu posted for breakfast and snack.

1060 - Snack Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (18) A snack shall include two (2) of the following:
- (a) Milk;
- (b) Protein;
- (c) Bread; or
- (d)1. Fruit;
- 2. Vegetable; or
- 3. 100 percent juice.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a half gallon of fruit punch was observed in the refrigerator. An interview with staff found that the fruit punch along with chips had been served for the afternoon snack the previous day.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, at the time of the visit conducted on 11/4/14 a pepperoni pizza was ordered for the children's lunch from Snappy Tomato Pizza. Along with the pizza the children were served canned peaches. The children were not served anything to drink and there was not an additional vegetable or fruit.
