During an interview with the staff person in charge it was indicated that the company has e-mailed her a copy but she was unable to provide the information at the time of the survey.

During an interview with the staff person in charge it was indicated that applications for the results of a criminal records check and child abuse and neglect checks have been submitted. However, there was no documentation to verify these applications had been filled out and submitted. At the time of the survey this staff person was not observed working alone with the children.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, there was one (1) staff person with a hire date of 10/1/16 who did not have a personnel file, therefore the documents required for employment could not be reviewed.

In addition there was a staff person present whose hire date was 10/1/16. This staff person did not have a file and did not have the results of a negative T.B. skin test or a statement from a health professional indicating the individual is free from the symptoms of T.B.

However, a review of documentation found that the form the facility is using states, "I give my permission for Kiddie City to transport ______ (child's name) for any excursion taken off the property of Kiddie City Childcare". There was no document in the childre's files that referenced the children walking to the park. The staff person in charge was asked about the word transport stated on the document and was reminded that the facility is not licensed for transportation. The staff person in charge indicated they only walk the children to the park.

During an interview with the staff person in charge it was indicated that a written plan had been submitted to the proper authorities but she did not keep documentation to verify the plan had been submitted.
