- 5. The results of background checks conducted in accordance with 922 KAR 2:280;**

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, one staff (hire date: 12/13/21) did not have a staff file at the facility; therefore, none of her identifying information could be determined. The staff was not alone during the survey, but was found to be working in the infant classroom.

405 - TB Verification

General: Based on review of documentation, four staff did not have evidence of negative TB documentation on file at the facility. Hire dates for these staff were 4/11/19, 4/11/19, 9/1/15, & 9/14/14. In addition, one staff (hire date: 12/13/21) did not have evidence of negative TB documentation on file prior to employment on file at the facility.

435 - Training

General: Based on review of documentation, six staff did not complete the required 15 hours of annual training between 07/01/2020 and 06/30/2021. In addition, three staff did not renew their PAHT which was due on 11/29/21(2) & 11/25/21.

General: Based on observation, in the Infant room there was a purse, cell phone, soda can, takeout food, and a take out cup on a table accessible to children. Also, there was a take out cup sitting on the floor by the Toddler room.

General: Based on observation, there was a light fixture in the entry way, Toddler room, and Toddler 2 room that were uncovered, leaving exposed bulbs. These bulbs were not shatter-proof.

General: Based on observation, the Toddler room had two broken ceiling tiles and several holes in the wall exposing the drywall.

 - (d) If reusable, be:
 - 1. Sanitized; and

General: Based on observation, the first aid kit did not contain gauze on the day of the survey.

775 - Medication

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
 - (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
 - 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
 - 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
 - 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
 - a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
 - b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
 - d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 13(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
 - 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
 - (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
 - (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was a tube of Desitin on a low table in the infant room. The medication was not labeled with a name and was within reach of the children.

- (9) Individual bedding shall be stored in a sanitary manner.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found in both the Toddler and Toddler 2 rooms, that the nap mats were stacked on top of each other with each children's sheet on them. Therefore, the children's bedding was touching. This is not a proper method of storage and promotes the spread of germs.

865 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
 - (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;

 - (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was a soap dispenser that was not attached to the bracket on the wall exposing the bracket which is a safety hazard to children.

General: Based on review of documentation, two children enrolled on 9/9/21 & 10/6/21, did not have up to date immunization records on file at the facility.

General: Based on review of documentation, three children's files did not have a preferred hospital listed on their enrollment paperwork at the facility.

General: Based on review of documentation, there was no evidence that the facility's Emergency Preparedness Plan had been updated or submitted to the proper authority for review.

(i) A written record of practiced fire drills conducted monthly detailing the date, time, and children who participated in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120, Section 3;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, there was no written evidence on file at the facility at the time of survey of fire, earthquake, tornado or lockdown drills being conducted. Therefore, the date, time, and children who participated could not be determined.

1305 - Fire Drills

(12) A fire drill shall be:

- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least monthly; and

General: Based on review of documentation, there was no written evidence of fire, earthquake, lockdown, and tornado drills being conducted at the facility during the time of inspection.

- (c) Each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year;
- (d) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's Web site as specified in KRS 199.897;
- (e) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including:
 - 1. Current rates for child care; and
 - 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and
- (g) Daily planned program.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the Toddler and Toddler 2 classrooms did not have current lesson plans posted. The posted lesson plans were dated for the week of November 1.

1330 - Diapering/Handwashing

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(9) The proper methods of diapering and hand-washing shall be posted at each diaper changing area.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the diaper changing steps were not posted above the changing table on the day of the survey. This changing table was located in the hallway between the toddler and toddler 2 classroom.
