520 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

General: Based on Observation the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements as evidence by the following: small rectangled rug in two year old classroom had a rolled up corner causing a potential safety hazard for children. The rug would slide across floor as children ran across it exposing cracked tile underneath. Further observation revealed another worn rug in the school age classroom as well as cracked tile.

- 3. After toileting or diaper change;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Staff member in the Four's classroom failed to instruct child to re-wash hands after playing with a trash can lid prior to lunch being served.

Findinas

General: Based on Observation the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon observation in the Toddler classroom, the staff member did not maintain personal cleanliness by washing their hands with liquid soap and water after wiping child's nose with a wet washcloth. Further obersvation in the Two year old classroom, revealed that staff failed to wash her hands in between wiping two separate children's noses.

The small blue chair located in the four year old class room contained several small tears and holes located along the seams on both sides of the chair where the material had become worn.

General: Based on Review of Documentation the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. The director did not present verification that the parent identified a preferred hospital for a child with the enrollment date of 10/25/2016.

Upon request the staff in charge did not provide verification that the daily attendance record for 01/23/2017 reflected the correct number of children in attendance. Review of the attendance record revealed twenty (20) children had been signed in. Observation revealed thirty-one (31) children in attendance.
