General: Based on review of documentation, a staff (DOH: 09/26/18) file presented for surveyor to review contained negative tuberculin verification dated 03/20/17, which was no longer current.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

### 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings

General: Based on review of documentation of staff files presented to surveyor for review and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A staff member (DOH: 04/19/15) had obtained only four (4) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training.
- 2. A staff member (DOH: 10/10/14) last completed the one and one half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma (PAHT) training on 06/10/13. A review of the staff member's file and a review of ECE-TRIS found no additional PAHT training; therefore, the PAHT training is not being completed every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation, the file presented for surveyor review for one (1) child (DOE: 08/15/18) did not contain the preferred hospital and preferred hospital telephone number.

General: Based on review of documentation, the files presented to surveyor for review found the following issues:

- 1. An employee (DOH: 10/10/14) record contained a professional development plan dated 01/05/16, which had not been updated annually as required.
- 2. An employee (DOH: 04/19/15) record contained a professional development plan dated 10/20/17, which had not been updated annually as required.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child care center failed to post up-to-date information on minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120. During interview with the director, she stated she was not aware the ratio information had been modified.
