General: Based on interview, the director allowed two (2) infant children, who showed signs of illness, admittance to the childcare program between 6-16-17 and 7-14-17. These infants were diagnosed with hand, foot and mouth illness.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, two (2) infant children who showed signs of illness were not isolated from the rest of the children and were not removed from the center in a timely manner. This incident occurred between 6-16-17 and 7-14-17.

General: Based on interview, the director failed to provide for the health of children in care. Children in the infant/toddler room who showed visible signs of illness between 6-16-17 and 7-14-17 were allowed to remain at the center and not isolated from other children.

(6) Cots, equipment, and furnishings used for sleeping and napping shall be spaced twelve (12) inches apart to allow free and safe movement by a person.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, less than twelve (12) inches were between nap mats and several mats were touching each other in the three (3) to four (4) year old room and the two (2) year old room. Each mat was occupied by a sleeping child.
