A caregiver's purse was stored in an unlocked cabinet under the counter in the three and four-year-olds' room. All of these items were accessible to children.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, a small roll of plastic trash bags were stored on top of a three (3) foot high shelf in the younger two and three-year olds' restroom. Four (4) small rolls of plastic trash bags were stored in an unlocked compartment under the sink in the restroom located in the hallway. A box of plastic top seal bags were stored in an unlocked cabinet under the sink in the three and four-year-olds' room. All of these items were accessible and were not a part of the planned program of instruction.
