Findings:

General: Based on observation, a staff member's Albuterol Sulfate inhaler was on the counter in the food prep area in the infant/toddler building.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a gallon size can of paint was stored on the bottom step, of the back exit, of the infant/toddlers building. The infant/toddler children used the steps to access the outdoor playground. In addition, various items of rubbish were stored immediately adjacent to these same steps.

General: Based on observation, five (5) Styrofoam cups and a Styrofoam bowl were on the ground in school-age children's outdoor play area. In addition, black plastic was on the ground, near the gate, in the school-age children's outdoor play area.

General: Based on observation, there were four (4) baseball size holes in various sections of the chain-linked fence that surrounded the outdoor play area. Also, the gate to the chain-linked fence was bent and would not close.

Findings:

General: Based on record review, nine (9) children enrolled 02/03/21, 03/02/20, 08/12/19, 02/22/21, 08/24/20, 11/24/14, 08/20/18, 08/18/14, 04/24/17, did not have allergy information listed on their enrollment form. Two (2) children, enrolled 02/03/21 and 8/18/14, did not have medical information listed on their enrollment form. A child enrolled 11/24/14 did not have parent contact information listed on the enrollment form. Also a child enrolled 8/12/19 did not have emergency contact information listed on the enrollment form.
