General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found during a tour of the facility with the staff person in charge:

1. The surveyor observed one staff person (hire date: 8/10/19) caring for 30 children (older school age) alone in the gym. The staff person in charge identified a second staff person (hire date: 9/30/18) that was assigned to the group, but indicated that he was escorting a child upstairs that was being picked up by her parent. The youngest child in the group was identified as a nine-year-old; therefore, the minimum staff to child ratio would need to be one staff person for 25 children. The facility exceeded the staff/child ratio by five children.

2. At approximatley 3:05PM, the surveyor observed one staff person (hire date: 8/10/19) caring for 17 children (younger school age) alone in Multipurpose Room A. The staff person in charge stated that a second staff person was assigned to the group; however, he was currently on a bus with the children that had been picked up from Garden Springs Elementary. This staff person (hire date: 8/12/19) arrived at the facility at 3:15PM. The youngest child in the group was identified as a five-year-old; therefore, the minimum staff to child ratio would need to be one staff person for 15 children. The facility exceeded the staff/child ratio by two children.

A review of Division of Regulated Child Care files found that this regulatory violation was previously issued as a result of a renewal inspection conducted on 3/4/19.

# Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, it was found that a bus driver and monitor are paired together during the transportation of children. On the day of the inspection (1/10/2020), one of these pairs (hire dates: 8/14/17 and 8/12/19) were lacking C.P.R. and first aid training.

A review of Division of Regulated Child Care files found that this regulatory violation was previously issued as a result of a renewal inspection conducted on 3/4/19.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
