  - (a) Infant and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
  - (b) Infant and child first aid.
- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) First aid.

### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired 11/20/14, and a caregiver hired 12/15/14, transported eight (8) preschool children on a field trip on 02/15/17. These two (2) caregivers did not have current first aid and infant/child CPR. Documentation revealed the caregivers first aid and infant/child CPR expired on 01/31/17.

#### 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
  - (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired 12/15/14, completed fourteen (14) hours of annual training.

- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After wiping or blowing nose;
- 6. After touching items soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 7. After outdoor or indoor play time.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2), two-year-old children did not wash their hands after outdoor play.

- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;

General: Based on observation, the infants' caregiver did not wash her hands before she fed an infant.

General: Based on observation and interview, an infant's milk bottle was not labeled. This bottle was on a shelf in the infants' room. Surveyor observed the infants' caregiver pick up the milk bottle and feed it to an infant.
