General: Based on observation, a plunger was being stored on the floor, beside the toilet in the children's bathroom used by the Marigolds classroom.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, in the Sweet Peas classroom, it was found that the latch on the cabinet door under the sink did not work properly. There was a bottle of the bathroom cleaner that was accessible to the children in care.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, in the Sprouts classroom, there was a spider web found in the corner of the room, above the door leading to the playground.

625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) Walls with peeled paint and holes in the Sweet Peas, Marigolds, Sprouts, Buttercups, and Magnolias classrooms.
- 2.) Excessive crayon marks on the wall and floor in the Buttercups classroom.
- 3.) The baseboard in the Magnolias bathroom was peeling off the wall.
- 4.) There were several pieces of the pulled carpet in the Sweet Peas classroom in the area that is used as a divider.

- (2) A toilet room shall:
- (a) 1. Be provided for each gender; or
- 2. A plan shall be implemented to use the same toilet room at separate times;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the toilet room in the Magnolias classroom was not clean. There were pieces of toilet paper on the floor and stains on the toilet.

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) An excessive amount of tape residue was accumulating dirt on the shelves in the Marigolds classroom.
- 2.) A table was not cleaned after a meal and contained food particles in the Buttercups classroom.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the daily planned program of activities posted in the Marigolds classroom was no longer current. The posted daily planned program of activities was dated for February 7.

- (b) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, there were two guinea pigs in the facility. In an interview with the staff person in charge it was found that the facility did not have written parental consent for the animals.
