- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) children enrolled on 3/3/22, each did not include the name of the child's physician and the physician's phone number in the enrollment information. Also, a child enrolled on 3/25/21, did not include the child's physician's phone number in the enrollment information.
