145 - Controlled Substance/Alcohol

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

(11) Except for medication as prescribed by a physician, a controlled substance or alcohol use shall not be permitted on the premises during hours of operation.

Findings:

General: Based on interviews and written statements provided by staff it was found that on 7/1/15 at approximately 2:15 p.m. emergency medical services were called because a staff person was found unresponsive in the girls' restroom downstairs. Police officers arrived on the scene and collected drug paraphernalia from the restroom. According to the police report that was received on 7/8/15 the following items were found and admitted into evidence: one (1) blue purse, one (1) cell phone, one (1) silver spoon with unknown white powder, one (1) used syringe, and one (1) baggie containing two (2) cut straws and a credit card. Based on interviews and written statements, the staff did not suspect the staff person was using drugs and had no concerns regarding her demeanor. On 7/1/15 at approximately 1:15 p.m., the staff person told a couple of the staff that she was going downstairs to work on her lesson plan. At approximately 2:15 p.m. the children's youth minister found the staff person in the downstairs restroom unresponsive and 911 was called. It is important to note there were no day care children present in the area downstairs where the staff person was found unresponsive. Based on interviews, the children go to the fellowship hall every day from 12:30 p.m. until 3:30 p.m. to eat lunch and nap. The staff person in charge stated the staff person who was found unresponsive would have gone over to the fellowship hall at approximately 2:30 p.m. to assist with naptime. However, based on interviews and record review, the staff person was later pronounced dead at the hospital.

922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.
