General: Based on observation and interview, at the time of the investigation on 5/17/19 it was found that there was little to no protective surfacing on the facility's playgrounds around and under the climbig/sliding/swinging equipment. The playground surface was mainly dirt and mud. A child fell from a peice of climbing equipment on 5/6/19 resulting in a fractured arm. The Director failed to provide for the children's safety by not ensuring that protective surfacing was in place under the climbing equipment on the playground. In an interview with the facility Director it was stated that she was aware that the playground needed additional surfacing and was expecting an order of mulch within the next week.

Based on observation and interview it was found that there was little to no protective surfacing on the facility's playgrounds around and under the climbing/sliding/swinging equipment. In an interview with the Director it was stated that the facility was expecting new mulch by the end of the week.
