- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;

- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;

- (c) Properly labeled.

General: Based on observation of the changing tables in the infant and two-year-old classroom, there were several tubes of diaper cream on the tables. The items were not labeled for individual use

- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff in charge did not present verification that the files for the children with the enrollment dates of 07/31/2019, 05/29/2019, 08/10/2020 and 10/01/2020 contained information listing the preferred hospital. Continued review revealed the record for the child with the enrollment date of 07/31/2019 did not contain verification of a person that was designated to pick up the child, emergency contact or the name of a physician listed on the enrollment form. The file for a child with the enrollment date of 10/01/2020 did not list a physician.

An employee in the two-year-old room was observed not wearing their mask properly. The nose region was exposed. Another employee was observed with five (5) children not wearing their mask properly, the nose and mouth region was exposed.
