General: Based on observation, during a tour of the Three & Four-Year- Old Classroom, the surveyor observed that one (1) small radio and two (2) small speakers had been placed on the ledge of the half door entrance to the classroom. The radio and speakers were not on a steady surface and the cords were within reach of the children. Therefore, the health, safety, and comfort of the children was not being met.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, during a tour of the outside playground, the surveyor observed three (3) ventilation openings in the building wall. One (1) of the ventilation openings was protected by a plastic, mesh screen. The other two (2) ventilation openings were not protected, leaving exposed insulation inside the opening. The openings were low enough and large enough for a child to stick their arm into and touch the insulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, during a tour of the childcare facility, the surveyor observed several dark stains on the carpets. The surveyor also observed bits of cereal and other debris on the carpets.

- (8) An opening to the outside shall be effectively protected against the entrance of vermin by:
- (a) Self-closing doors;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, during a tour of the outside playground, the surveyor observed three (3) ventilation openings in the building wall. One (1) of the ventilation openings was protected by a plastic, mesh screen. The other two (2) ventilation openings were not protected; therefore, leaving access for vermin to possibly enter the building.

General: Based on observation of the girls' restroom, the surveyor observed that the toilet seat and the outer bowl was not clean.

Findings:

General: Based on observation of the first aid kit, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. There was no liquid hand soap in the first aid kit supplies.
- 2. The flashlight in the first aid kit was not working due to dead batteries.

General: Based on observation of the child care center's playground, the surveyor observed there to be a large table umbrella being used with a child-sized picnic table. The base of the umbrella was not weighted enough to keep the umbrella standing upright. Therefore, the umbrella could fall causing injury to a child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, during a tour of the Infant Classroom, the surveyor observed two (2) cribs to have soiled sheets on the mattresses. The infants were all awake and playing on the floor. Therefore, the sheets were not immediately changed after being soiled.
