General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A packet of Wet Wipes in a clear 3 drawer cabinet that was labeled "Teacher's Drawer." The packet of Wet Wipes stated, "Keep Out of Reach of Children," on the back label. The surveyor observed the drawer to be unlocked and the packet of Wet Wipes to be within reach of children.
- 2. A plunger that was beside the toilet in the restroom located in the Preschool Classroom.

The items were observed to be accessible to children.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and review of ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found a staff (DOH: 06/20/22) completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 05/17/17; therefore, the training was not completed within the last five years.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. In the One Year Old Classroom, one (1) ceiling tile with a discolored water spot.
- 2. In the Two Year Old Classroom, two (2) ceiling tiles with discolored water spots.

Therefore, the child-care center failed to keep the ceiling in good repair.

695 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and

730 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

(d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the toilet located in the Two Year Old Classroom restroom would not drain the water when flushed. The surveyor flushed the toilet that had fecal matter and urine in the toilet bowl; however, the toilet would not drain. Therefore, the toilet was not kept in clean condition and good repair.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found debris on the diaper changing table underneath the diaper changing pad in the One Year Old Classroom; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.

- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A child's (DOE: 11/03/20) file did not contain the contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital, the name of the child's preferred hospital, the name of the child's preferred hospital, the name of the child's preferred physician, the name of the child's preferred physician or the child's pick up/emergency contact information.
- 2. A child's (DOE: 12/23/21) file did not contain the contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital.
