(1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.

- (2) A child care staff member hired on or after April 1, 2018, shall:
- (a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and been found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or
- (b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;
- 2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation: and
- 3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain background checks in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the nursery at 8:43 a.m. revealed two (2) staff members with the hire dates 2/15/19 and 2/25/19 were caring for five (5) children. Upon request completed NBCP with an eligible status was not presented for review for either of the two (2) staff members with the hire dates 2/15/19 and 2/25/19.

Observation of the toddler room at 8:45 a.m. revealed a staff member with the hire date 11/21/16 was the sole care giver for twelve (12) children. Upon request a completed NBCP with an eligible status was not presented for review for the staff member with the hire date 11/21/16.

Observation of the nursery at 8:53 a.m. revealed the staff member with the hire date 2/25/19 had left the room and was in the toddler room caring for children; therefore leaving a staff

member with the hire date 2/15/19 as the sole care giver for five (5) children.

Observation of the school age room at 8:55 a.m. revealed a staff member with the hire date 4/8/15 was the sole care giver for seventeen (17) children. Upon request a completed

Observation of the school age room at 8:55 a.m. revealed a staff member with the hire date 4/8/15 was the sole care giver for seventeen (17) children. Upon request a completed NBCP with an eligible status was not presented for review for the staff member with the hire date 4/8/15.

Interview with the owner verified that the NBCP had not been submitted or completed for the aforementioned staff members. Review of a KARES report revealed the aforementioned staff members with the hire dates; 4/8/15, 11/21/16, 2/15/19 and 2/25/19 were listed as pending employees, but the background checks had not yet been requested.



10 - Submit background check

- (1) To initiate the process for obtaining background checks on a prospective child care staff member, the child care provider shall:
- (a) Request that the prospective child care staff member provide a copy of his or her driver's license or other government-issued photo identification and verify that the photograph clearly matches the prospective child care staff member;

- 2. DCC-501, Disclosures to Be Provided to and Signed by the Applicant Child Care Staff Member; and
- (c) Log on to the NBCP portal and enter the prospective child care staff member's demographic information for a check of the:
- 1. Child abuse and neglect central registry pursuant to 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. National Crime Information Center's National Sex Offender Registry in accordance with 34 U.S.C. 20921; and
- 3. Sex Offender Registry established in accordance with KRS 17.500 through 17.580.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain background checks in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request documentation was not presented to verify that the child care center had initiated the process for obtaining background checks for staff members with the hire dates: 4/8/15, 11/21/16, 2/15/19, 12/12/18, 2/25/19, 5/6/19, and 2/26/18.

15 - Submit fingerprints Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:280. Section 4. Procedures and Payments.

(4)(a) Upon submission of payment in accordance with subsections (2) and (3) of this section, the child care provider shall print a copy of the DCC-504, Applicant Child Care Staff Member Live Scan Fingerprinting Form, from the NBCP portal and provide the form to the child care staff member.

- (b) The child care staff member shall:
- 1. Have no more than ninety (90) calendar days from the date of payment pursuant to subsections (2) and (3) of this section to submit the child care staff member's fingerprints at an authorized collection site for NBCP; and
- 2. Present the DCC-504 and driver's license or other government-issued photo identification to the designated agent at an authorized collection site prior to fingerprint submission.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain background checks in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request documentation was not presented to verify that each staff member for the child care center had submitted fingerprints for the NBCP.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain adequate supervision in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the school age room revealed there were no children or adults in the room when the door from the playground opened and a child entered the room, closing the door behind them. The child proceeded to walk through the child care center with no adult supervision. The child then walked to the toddler room opened the door and entered the room where the child went and sat on the floor with the other children. Observation in the school age room at 10:00 a.m. (where there were no children or adults in the room) revealed the door from the playground opened and a child entered the room, closing the door behind them, the child then entered the bathroom closing the door, the child exited the bathroom at 10:03 a.m., opened the door to the playground and went outside.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Observation of the toddler room at 8:42 a.m. revealed twelve (12) children in care with one (1) staff member. Interview with the staff member revealed the youngest age child in care was two-years-old. Observation of the toddler room at 8:53 a.m. revealed seventeen (17) children in care with two (2) staff members. Interview with a staff member revealed the youngest age child in care was one-year-old. Review of the child's file verified the child was one-years-old.

Observation of the school age room at 8:55 a.m. revealed seventeen (17) children in care with one (1) staff member. Interview with the staff member revealed the youngest age child in care was five-years-old. Observation of the school age room at 9:36 a.m. revealed nineteen (19) children in care with one (1) staff member. Interview with the staff member revealed the youngest age child in the room was five-years-old.

Observation of the kitchen at lunch time revealed a staff member entered the room retrieved cups and then proceeded to the toddler room, where the surveyor followed. Upon entering, the toddler room there was only one (1) staff member with seventeen (17) children when the second staff member left to retrieve the cups from the kitchen. Interview with the staff member revealed the youngest age child in the room was two-years-old.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements. Observation of the child care center revealed forty-two (42) children in care at the time of the survey. Observation revealed there were nineteen (19) children in the school age room, seventeen (17) children in the toddler room and six (6) children in the nursery. Interview with staff members verified the number of children in each room. Review of Division of Regulated Child Care (DRCC) records revealed the child care center is licensed to provide care for forty (40) children. Review of DRCC records revealed the child care center has not applied for an increase in capacity.

Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request a current copy of regulations was not presented for review. Interview with the owner revealed the child care center did not have current regulations

40 - Staff Meeting Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (i) Conduct, manage, and document in writing recurring staff meetings;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request documentation of staff meetings was not presented for review. Interview with the owner revealed staff meetings have been conducted; however, not all have been documented.

345 - Staff Evaluation Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request a staff evaluation was not presented for review for three (3) staff members with the hire dates; 4/8/15, 11/21/16 and 2/26/18.

350 - Health, Safety, Comfort Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings

General: Based on observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the nursery revealed two (2) electrical outlets not covered located by the changing table and high chairs. Observation of the toddler room revealed an electrical outlet not covered located by the child's couch. Observation of the bathroom located in the toddler room revealed an electrical outlet not covered. Continued observation of the bathroom located in the toddler room revealed a plunger by the toilet that was accessible to children.

360 - Caregiver Alone Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall
- (n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:280;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the nursery at 8:43 a.m. revealed two (2) staff members with the hire dates 2/15/19 and 2/25/19 were caring for five (5) children. Upon request completed NBCP with an eligible status was not presented for review for either of the two (2) staff members with the hire dates 2/15/19 and 2/25/19.

Observation of the toddler room at 8:45 a.m. revealed a staff member with the hire date 11/21/16 was the sole care giver for twelve (12) children. Upon request a completed NBCP with an eligible status was not presented for review for the staff member with the hire date 11/21/16.

Observation of the nursery at 8:53 a.m. revealed the staff member with the hire date 2/25/19 had left the room and was in the toddler room caring for children; therefore leaving a staff member with the hire date 2/15/19 as the sole care giver for five (5) children.

Observation of the school age room at 8:55 a.m. revealed a staff member with the hire date 4/8/15 was the sole care giver for seventeen (17) children. Upon request a completed NBCP with an eligible status was not presented for review for the staff member with the hire date 4/8/15.

Interview with the owner verified that the NBCP had not been submitted or completed for the aforementioned staff members. Review of a KARES report revealed the aforementioned staff members with the hire dates; 4/8/15, 11/21/16, 2/15/19 and 2/25/19 were listed as pending employees, but the background checks had not yet been requested.

- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request a high school diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential was not presented for review for two (2) staff members with the hire dates; 12/12/18 and 2/25/19.



395 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request written documentation from a health care professional was not presented for review to verify that a staff member with the hire date 4/8/15 was free from active TB.

400 - CPR/First Aid Coverage

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Infant and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) Infant and child first aid.
- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) First aid.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements.

Review of the presented staff schedule and staff files revealed the child care center does not have any staff member currently certified in adult and pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first aid. Review of documentation presented for certification in adult and pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first aid revealed it expired in April 2019. Interview with the owner verified there are no staff members certified in adult and pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first aid at this time.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of presented staff files revealed four (4) staff members with the hire dates; 4/8/15, 2/26/18 and 11/21/16 did not complete fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training. Review of the ECE TRIS report did not verify that the training hours had been completed. Interview with the owner revealed she was not able to verify the training hours were completed.

Review of presented staff files revealed three (3) staff members with the hire dates; 12/12/18, 2/15/19 and 2/25/19 did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within ninety (90) days of employment. Interview with the owner revealed she was not able to verify that the orientation training was completed within ninety (90) days of employment for the aforementioned staff member. Review of ECE TRIS report could not verify that the training had been completed.

Upon request documentation was not presented to verify that two (2) staff members with the hire dates; 11/21/16 and 2/26/18 had completed pediatric abusive head trauma training.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation of the school age room revealed there were no materials for block play and dramatic play. Interview with a staff member revealed there were no materials for block play and dramatic play. Observation of the toddler room revealed there were no materials for block play and science. Interview with a staff member revealed there were not materials for block play and science. Review of the posted lesson plan in the nursery revealed it was not current. The lesson plan presented for the nursery was dated for the week of 5/6/19.

510 - Appropriate Use of Food

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (2) Food shall not be:
- (a) Used for reward;
- (b) Used for discipline;
- (c) Withheld until all other foods are consumed; or

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation of lunch time in the toddler room revealed seventeen (17) children were given plates with food on them. Continued observation revealed milk was served later after some children had consumed his / her food.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the school age room revealed the following: 1. The purple wall was soiled, 2. The green wall was soiled, 3. The gray doors were soiled. Observation of the toddler room revealed the following: 1. The pink and blue walls were soiled, 2. Chipped and peeling paint on the pink and blue walls. Observation of the bathroom located off the toddler room revealed the following: 1. The walls are soiled, 2. The door is soiled, 3. Peeled paint exposing the drywall board. Observation of the nursery revealed chipped and peeling paint on the green and pink walls.



560 - Building Requirements

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:
- (a) Building is:
- 1. Dry;
- 2. Ventilated; and
- 3. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the nursery revealed a light that was out causing an area of the room to be dimly lit. Observation of the toddler room revealed a light that was out causing an area of the room to be dimly lit.

565 - 35 Square Feet per Child Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(6) Exclusive of the kitchen, bathroom, hallway, and storage area, there shall be a minimum of thirty-five (35) square feet of space per child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements.

Observation of the school age room at 8:55 a.m. revealed seventeen (17) children in care. Observation of the school age room at 9:36 a.m. revealed nineteen (19) children in care. Review of the child care center's floor plan on file with DRCC revealed the school age room has space for fifteen (15) children.

Observation of the toddler room at 8:53 a.m. revealed seventeen (17) children in care. Review of the child care center's floor plan on file with DRCC revealed the toddler room has space for fifteen (15) children; therefore the child care center exceeded the minimum of thirty-five (35) square feet of space per child.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the toddler room revealed holes in the blue wall. Interview with the owner revealed she was aware of the holes in wall in the toddler room. Observation of the bathroom located off the toddler room revealed three (3) holes in the wall.

645 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the bathroom located off the school age room revealed there was not a hand-drying blower and there were no single use disposable hand drying materials. Observation of the sink located in the school age room revealed the water temperature registered eighty (80) degrees Fahrenheit. Observation of the sink located in the toddler room revealed it was not operational (there was no hot or cold water). Observation of the sink located in the bathroom off the toddler room revealed the following: 1. There was not a hand-drying blower and there were no single use disposable hand drying materials 2. There was not a waste receptacle.



Hygienic Practices

655 - Child Personal Care/Handwashing

- (4) A child shall:
- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon his or her developmental skills;
- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon the surveyors entry into the toddler room a child arrived for care then went and sat down without washing his/her hands. Observation in the toddler room at 9:10 a.m. revealed a child arrived for care where he / she went and joined the other children without washing his / her hands.

680 - Soiled Diapers/Clothing

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (8) Diapers or clothing shall be:
