- (1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.
- (2) A child care staff member hired on or after April 1, 2018, shall:
- (a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and been found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or
- (b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;
- 2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation: and
- 3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.

Findings:

General: The child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding background checks. Based on observation and a review of documentation, a review of documentation failed to reveal a completed CAN check for an employee with a hire date of 7/14/2020. Documentation was submitted, however, results had not been received by the provider. The staff member was observed alone in the Pre Toddler classroom.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain adequate supervision in accordance with regulatory requirements. Based on observation, a staff member exited the Pre-Toddler room leaving an unqualified staff alone with three (3) children ranging in age from two (2) years to three (3) years. The staff member was out of the room for approximately less than one (1) minute. The unqualified staff's hire date is 07/14/2020.

- (I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed an electrical outlet in the wall adjacent to a crib Interview with the staff member revealed a toddler, aged 2-3 years old, did use the crib for napping.

360 - Caregiver Alone Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:280;

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation in the Pre-Toddler room revealed an unqualified staff member alone with three (3) children ranging in age from two (2) years to three (3) years, for less than one (1) minute when the qualified staff member exited the room to obtain a mask. A review of documentation failed to reveal a completed CAN check for the aforementioned employee with the hire date of 07/14/2020.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the premises revealed the door into the kitchen was propped open during the survey. Within the kitchen was a closet with the door standing open. The closet contained 2 jugs of bleach, a container of Oxyclean Stain Remover, 2 bottles of Lysol toilet bowl cleaner, 2 bottles of Homeline bleach cleaner, 3 bottles of Mr. Clean multi-surface cleaner and 2 jugs of Purex laundry detergent, all of which contained a warning stating 'Keep Out of the Reach of Children'.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed a child's soiled finger bandage was removed and replaced with a new bandage without the staff member washing her hands prior to, or after, applying the bandage.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation in the Pre Toddler room revealed a broken piece of wood lying on the changing table under the changing pad. Also observed were two (2) books lying on the pad.

Findinas

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed broken, and rotted timbers with sharp shards of wood, separating one area of playground from another area of playground. Part of the play area contained berries from a tree, scattered over a large portion of the area. A pile of toys and play equipment were observed in a corner of the playground. Interview with staff members failed to reveal whether the contents of the pile were to be discarded as irreparable items, or kept.

765 - Infant/Toddler Outdoor Space

- (4) If a child-care center provides an outdoor play area for an infant or toddler under twenty-four (24) months of age, the outdoor area shall be:

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Based on observation, there failed to be a shaded area for toddlers.

Equipment Not In Compliance

790 - Crib/Mattress/Sheet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (a) For an infant:
- 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation in the Pre Toddler room revealed eight (8) cribs. A review of documentation failed to reveal documentation verifying that the cribs were in compliance with C.F.R. 1219-1220. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the visit. Additionally, two (2) of the mattresses, revealed serverely torn and ripped coverings, exposing interior materials.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation in the PreToddler room revealed five (5) white and green high chairs. A child was observed eating lunch in the high chair that failed to be equipped with a safety belt. The chair was observed to contain slits for a belt.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain posting requirements. A review of documentation failed to reveal a 2019 Plan of Corrections submitted by the provider to the cabinet. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the visit.

1215 - Daily Activities Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (h) Post a schedule of daily activities, to include dates and times of activities to be conducted with the children in each classroom;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to assure compliance with posting requirements. A review of documentation in the Pre Toddler room failed to reveal a posted, daily schedule. Based on interview with staff, a daily schedule was not available at the time of the visit.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with emergency regulations. Observation in the PreToddler room revealed a staff member at lunch time failing to wear a mask over her nose and mouth while with three (3) children.
