General: Based on observation, an electrical outlet was not covered in the reading area of the school-age room.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 5/28/19, did not have an annual written performance evaluation on file.

395 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 4/8/15, had TB documentation on file that was dated 5/11/18. A caregiver hired on 6/4/19, had TB documentation on file that was dated 6/16/19. Also, a caregiver hired on 5/28/19, had TB documentation on file that was dated 11/1/18.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 1/3/20, lacked six and a half (6 ½) hours of training during the first year of employment. A caregiver hired on 5/28/19, lacked fourteen (14) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment and did not complete the Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma Training. A caregiver hired on 6/5/19, lacked nine (9) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment and last completed the Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma Training on 6/27/16. A caregiver hired on 6/4/19, lacked thirteen (13) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. A caregiver hired on 5/28/19, lacked fifteen (15) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a can of Great Value Disinfectant Spray was on a shelf and was accessible to the children in the school-age room.

560 - Building Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:
- (a) Building is:
- 1. Dry;
- 2. Ventilated; and
- 3. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:
- a. In good repair in all areas; and
- b. Shielded or have shatter-proof bulbs installed; and
- (b) Following are protected:
- 1. Windows;
- 2. Doors;
- 3. Stoves;
- 4. Heaters;
- 5. Furnaces;
- 6. Pipes; and

Findings:

General: Based on observation, dead bugs were in a light fixture in the restroom and six (6) light fixtures in the school-age room. Dead bugs were in three (3) light fixtures in the infants' room. Dead bugs were in seven (7) light fixtures in the two and three-year-olds' room.

645 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a sink was inoperable in the two and three-year-olds' room. An interview revealed the sink leaked and was turned off until it was repaired.

General: Based on observation, an approximately four and a half (4 1/2) feet tall green and black climbing dome was not anchored to the ground in the outdoor play area.

- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the manufacturer's label on a green and black climbing dome indicated the product was intended for use by children aged three to ten-years-old and was for residential use only. The dome was located in the outdoor play area.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, fifteen (15) children were present, and only twelve (12) children had a documented arrival time. Therefore, three (3) children did not have a documented arrival time.

- (h) A written record of quarterly practiced earthquake drills and tornado drills detailing the date, time, and children who participated in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120, Section 3;
- (i) A written record of practiced fire drills conducted monthly detailing the date, time, and children who participated in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120, Section 3;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, fire drills were conducted in May and June 2021, but the date, time and name of participants were not documented.

1195 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (12) A fire drill shall be:
- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least monthly; and
- (b) Documented.
- (13) An earthquake drill and a tornado drill shall be:
- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least quarterly; and
- (b) Documented.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, fire drills were conducted in May and June 2021 but were not documented.
