General: Based on review of documentation, staff hired on 09/10/2020, 05/15/15, 02/23/17 and 09/07/2021 did not have documentation on file from a health care professional stating they were free of active tuberculosis.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on observation, there was a child "hanging out" in the receptionist area and office during the inspection. The staff person in charge stated that he was a school age child and his school was closed for the week due to Covid19. The staff person stated that the school was not utilizing non traditional days so the child was at the facility while his parents worked. It was noted that the child did not have a classroom or area designated for him during the inspection. The child was observed sitting around in the reception area with nothing to do while his teacher was cleaning the front office area.
