Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the childcare center, the surveyor found the following:

1. A large bag of salt and a pressure washer were stored beside the exit door in the dining area of Toddler Room #1. Through interview with staff, the surveyor learned that the children had eaten lunch in the dining area; therefore, the items were accessible to the children.
2. Four (4) large blue empty plastic bags were stored in the children's cubbies located in Toddler Room #1. The bags were accessible to the children.
3. A can of paint was stored in an unlocked cabinet located under the sink in the classroom for the two-year-old children. The paint was accessible to the children.
4. A pair of sharp-pointed scissors were observed in an unlocked cabinet located in the classroom for the four-year-old children. The scissors were within reach and accessible to the children.

General: Based on observation during a tour of the classroom for the four-year-old children, the surveyor found an abundance of dead bugs in the ceiling light fixture located in the restroom.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that the hot water was not working at the sink located in the restroom used by the three-year-old children.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that the diaper changing table used for the two-year-old children was not padded. Through interview, staff confirmed that a diaper pad is not used when changing the children.

710 - Toy Sanitation Procedure

- (4) A toy or another item that is considered a mouth contact surface by a child not toilet trained shall be sanitized daily by:**
- (a) 1. Scrubbing in warm, soapy water using a brush to reach into crevices;**

 - 3. Submerging in a sanitizing solution for at least two (2) minutes; and**
 - 4. Air dried; or**
 - (b) Cleaning in a dishwasher if the toy or other item is dishwasher safe.**

Findings:

General: Based on interview, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. Staff in Toddler Room #1 stated that the mouth contact toys are sprayed with soapy water, scrubbed with a brush, rinsed, submerged in bleach water for five (5) minutes and air dried.
 - 2. Staff in the classroom for the three-year-old children confirmed that not all of the children are potty trained. The staff identified that the mouth contact toys are washed in a bucket using antibacterial soap. The toys are then wiped dry.
- The proper method to sanitize mouth contact toys is as follows: Scrub in warm, soapy water using a brush to reach into crevices, rinse in clean water, submerge in a sanitizing solution for at least two (2) minutes and air dry.

General: Based on observation during a tour of the classroom for the two-year-old children, the surveyor found that an unlocked first aid kit was located on a table within reach of the children.

730 - Medication

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:**
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:**
 - 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;**
 - 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;**
 - 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:**

 - b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;**

- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the classroom for the two-year-old children, the surveyor found that an unlocked first aid kit was located on a table within reach of the children. The first aid kit contained A&D Ointment, two (2) tubes of Nystatin Ointment, sunblock, Bag Balm, and prescription Hydrocortisone Cream. The medications were not stored in a separate and locked place.
