Findings:

General: Based on Observation, two (2) wadded up plastic bags were stored in an unlocked drawer at the sink cabinets in room 115. Six (6) boxes of top seal plastic bags were stored in an unlocked lower cabinet at the sink cabinets in room 115. These items were accessible to children and were not a part of the planned program of instruction.
